

Speaking Ski: A Love Language

The following article originally appeared in the June/July 2009 issue of the NSAA (National Ski Areas Association) Journal and has been edited by the author for publication in the Miami Ski Club Newsletter.

It certainly wasn't my idea to move from Minnesota to Florida in the middle of ski season. After all, I had just bought a new pair of Fisher racing skis for Nastar.

My husband, Juan, knew I was a skier when we first met but he didn't really understand what that meant until after we were married and he witnessed my post-summer pre-skiing regimen. The day after Labor Day I start checking the temperature on the outdoor thermometer daily. I try on my ski pants after the non-skiing sedentary summer and start an aggressive diet/exercise program. By Halloween my ski gear is clean, polished, sharpened, waxed, fondled, and placed within easy access for the first snowfall. I was raised to love and prepare for winter and Juan and I raised our kids the same way. My parents said if you raise children with lots of fresh, cold air in the wintertime and stuff them full of spaghetti afterwards, they'll be too tired to get into trouble. It was good advice.

At some point during our marriage, though, Juan changed his attitude towards winter. I think it started when our four snow shoveling-sons flew the coop. Then a few years later, a couple of low-snow winters prevented him from snowmobiling behind the house. He mentioned moving south a couple of times but I thought he was kidding. I should have suspected his motives when photo albums of family vacations to Disney World and the Florida Keys magically appeared from storage and were displayed like Van Gogh's in the living room. Then I knew he was serious when he fabricated a story about work opportunities, as if I'm actually going to believe his twelve-year profession of selling boats and yachts would be more lucrative in south Florida than in Minnesota. I was still resistant to the idea of moving to Florida until he dangled the carrot. "You can fly back to Minnesota to go skiing with your dad and sisters whenever you want," he said casually, then added the deal-maker. "But since we'll be living on the east coast you should really ski in Europe. It's almost as close and you'd look great in St. Moritz with a Florida tan." He never did fight fair.

One of the hardest adjustments to living in south Florida has been finding someone who I can relate to and can relate to me. Don't misunderstand, our condo building has a wonderful group of people from a variety of backgrounds and nationalities: Italians from New York; Canadians from Quebec City; Hungarians from Vancouver; Cubans from,

well, Cuba. And while some of them have skied, none of them are skiers. They're all like my husband; they hate the snow and love the beach, which is why they're here. They simply do not understand why I mourn the loss of snow. A few months after our arrival my mood became more and more sullen and Juan thought an intervention might be needed. When I started to envision chairlifts on Mount Trashmore, the community landfill, and asked if he thought the floating ash from fires in the everglades could accumulate enough skiable base, we both knew I needed help.

Help came in the form of one of the largest ski clubs in the nation, the Miami Ski Club. Established in 1968, the club sponsors no less than half a dozen ski trips to the western U.S. and Europe, and several other trips throughout the year for snorkeling, diving, sailing, camping, golf and tennis. Weekly Friday night happy hours provide a great opportunity to meet people who speak the same ski-language as me. At the first happy hour we attended we met Ron, seemingly the club's south-Beach-styled self-appointed welcome wagon, who invited us to join him for dinner afterwards. He regaled us with the history of the ski club, stories of past ski trips, and plans for future trips. We talked until midnight and made plans to see him again at subsequent happy hours. The next week I mailed our membership application and check. A few weeks later we attended the annual Miami Ski Club Summerfest at the Riviera Country Club in Coral Gables, where members sign up for winter trips. I thought about Park City or Jackson Hole but registered for the trip to Cortina, Italy. Juan should have known better than to dangle the Europe carrot so carelessly.

I've become more acclimated to life in south Florida now. I think part of my adjustment is due to finally appreciating the warm, sunny weather and snorkeling on the reef in my backyard. Part of it might be from walking on the beach every morning to see if another sea turtle nest hatched during the night by evidence of baby turtle tracks all over the beach. Or maybe I've adjusted because I finally discovered that no matter where I live, as long as I can find someone who speaks "ski", I'm not alone.
